



PREPARING EUROPE FOR FUTURE HEALTH CRISES

BE READY NOW, the European Partnership for Pandemic Preparedness aims to strengthen the EU's capacity to prevent and respond to infectious disease threats. It will enhance coordination, accelerate knowledge acquisition, support the development of medical countermeasures and build a research infrastructures ecosystem including an EU-wide network of clinical research. Spanning 10 years, the partnership will begin in January 2026, with a budget of €118 million allocated to its first three-year phase.

OUR MISSION

To establish a European Research and Innovation ecosystem that is optimally prepared for future health crises caused by infectious diseases, which can respond to them swiftly and efficiently and that is fully integrated in the wider European institutional Health Security framework.


